The Alaska Peninsula is not only renowned for the largest brown bear in universe, but also the most unpredictable weather on the planet. The days leading up to the 2009 fall bear season brought mid-forty temperatures, overcast skies, wind, drizzle and rain. But

the clouds parted on opening day for Mark Alyn of Plano, Texas and he and his Cinder River Lodge guide, Jim Bauers spotted this magnificent Alaska brown bear working its way along



the salmon stream where they were camped. Their careful stalk brought them within 40 yards of the bear before Mark squeezed off his first of three shots, from the .375 Ruger purchased especially for his Alaska bear hunt at Cinder River Lodge.

Cinder River Lodge

Cinder River Lodge is located about midway down the Alaska Peninsula. Our hunting area includes a large exclusive hunting concession in the Aniakchak National Park/Preserve. We also have several camps on the adjacent lands managed by the State of Alaska Department of Natural Resources. This huge hunting area stretches from Bristol Bay to the Pacific Ocean and includes nearly 2,000 square miles of trophy moose and brown bear habitat. The terrain varies from coastal beaches to brushy lowlands, hills and the alpine Aleutian Mountains which separate the Bristol Bay side from the Pacific side of the Alaska Peninsula. We base two aircraft at the lodge during the hunting season. Our facilities include a hunter's bunkhouse, shower house and the main lodge with a kitchen / dining area, living room and two small guest rooms for couples and some of our crew. The lodge has running water and generated electrical power. At Cinder River Lodge, you will enjoy delicious family style meals prepared by our lodge cook. In spike camps, we provide whole foods, rather than freeze dried which is too often served on Alaska hunts. All of the food, supplies and camp gear are provided for your hunt. Clients need only bring their favorite rifle (30 caliber magnum or larger), ammunition,



personal clothing, footwear and a good quality sleeping bag. The experienced bush pilots at Cinder River Lodge will fly each hunter and his guide from the lodge to their own private spike camp, to hunt for the trophy desired. All hunts are fair-chase and on foot from our comfortable tented camps which are strategically located within our vast guide area. Camps are checked often by: radio, satellite telephone or our lodge aircraft. Cinder River Lodge employs only licensed professional guides, trained in First Aid and experienced in the situations



that arise in the field such as: judging trophies, skinning, butchering and fleshing. Our professional guides will see to the field care, fleshing and salting of your trophy as well as all of the other necessary duties in and around the spike camp.

Booking Information

HOW TO CONFIRM YOUR HUNT:

To confirm a hunt in the current year, a 50% deposit is required. To book a hunt in a future year, a 25% confirmation deposit is required and is subject to a \$1,000.00 cancellation or change fee. By January 1st, of the year of the hunt, all deposits must be brought up to 50% for final confirmation. Deposits are non-refundable unless the space is filled by the cancelling party 60 days before the hunt. Openings are very limited, so book early to assure space!

INCLUSIONS AND EXCLUSIONS:

Our hunting and fishing packages include everything that you will need once you arrive at Cinder River Lodge except: guns & ammo, hunting license and tags, sleeping bag, liquor, personal items and gratuities.
