The Big Bear Brothers

You would think that one ELEVEN FOOT bear would be quite enough for any family, but not for brothers Chris and Mike Dianda of Reno, who have now each taken a monster eleven foot brown bear at Wildman Lake Lodge.

During the spring hunt in 2006, the boys accompanied their father Norman, to hunt with Gary "Butch" King on the Alaska Peninsula. During that spring hunt, Dad took a nine footer, Chris took this ELEVEN FOOTER and Mike took a nine-nine and two Alaskan wolves.

Waiting only the four regulatory years required by Alaska law to hunt brown bear again, Mike and Chris returned to Wildman Lake

With two Eleven Footers, a Nine-Nine and Chris's Ten-Two, the Dianda Brothers have more than Forty-Two feet of brown bear hide between them and have hunted a total of 8 days.

A FAMILY TRADITION

It all began with youngest brother Adam, taking a big 10'-8" Brown Bear scoring 28-12/16 SCI, at Wildman Lake Lodge in the fall of 2007. The B'ar (pardon the pun) was set for the rest of the Gregory family of Austin, Texas.



Arriving for the opening of the 2009 fall bear season, brother Paul and sister Rebekah came to establish a family tradition that won't

be easy to follow. On the fourth day of the season, Paul downed this monster 10'-7 brownie which scored 28-05/16 SCI, and on day eight, Rebekah took this old 9'-4" bruin scoring 27 inches even.

Pistol Packin' Mama!

"So there I am, last hours of the 2009 SCI convention and this frail little lady walks up to my booth and says she wants to shoot a brown bear with her pistol" explains Butch King, Master

Guide at Wildman Lake Lodge. "It wasn't until much later did I realize that I had just booked Audrey Murtland, a world renown huntress, founder of the SABLES organization and Safari

Club's first DIANA award winner. I'm not the one to tell you a lady's age, but I was amazed to learn that Audrey was born just a few days after my own father, and I'm no spring chicken anymore."

I flew Audrey, who had arrived alone, and her guide Jesse, to a weatherport camp just 12 miles from the lodge. Here they had both a jet boat and a four wheeler to help navigate the rough country. After enduring six days of harsh Alaska Peninsula weather they finally got into position, and Audrey took this beautiful Alaska brown bear with a single shot from her Thompson Contender pistol.



Wildman Lake Lodge

Wildman Lake Lodge is located on the remote Alaska Peninsula. The Wildman hunting concessions include a large portion of the Alaska Peninsula Wildlife Refuge as well as lands managed by the State of Alaska. Combined, these concessions reach from the Bering Sea to the Pacific Ocean and include approximately 2,000 square miles of Alaska's finest trophy moose and brown bear habitat. Wildman Lake Lodge is a deluxe wilderness lodge facility located at the base of glacier-shrouded Mt. Veniaminof, on the banks of Ocean River, one of Alaska's finest clear water sport fishing streams. You will not find a more comfortable and finely appointed sport hunting lodge in all of Alaska. Wildman is the perfect lodge for corporate hunting groups, hunting couples or the most discriminating trophy hunter. Our lodge guests enjoy comfortable duplex cabins, each with a hot shower, baseboard heat and continuous electrical power. Wildman's spacious lodge boasts of delicious family style meals. In our comfortable tented spike camps, hunters are served whole foods and frozen meals prepared by our Lodge Chef, rather than freeze



dried or military rations which is too often served on Alaska hunts. All of the food, supplies and camp gear are provided for your hunt. Clients need only bring their favorite rifle (30 caliber magnum or larger), ammunition, personal clothing, footwear and a good quality sleeping bag. Wildman's experienced bush pilots will fly each hunter and his guide from the main lodge to their own private spike camp to hunt for the trophy desired. Hunting is Fair-Chase, from comfortable tented

spike camps. Our camps are checked often by: radio, satellite telephone or one of the lodge's numerous bush aircraft. Each Wildman Lake Lodge hunting guide is a licensed professional, trained in First Aid and experienced in the situations that arise in the field such as: judging trophies, skinning, butchering and fleshing. The Wildman Lake Lodge guides also will see to the field care, fleshing and salting of your trophy as well as the other necessary duties in and around the spike camp.

Booking Information

HOW TO CONFIRM YOUR HUNT:

To confirm your hunt for the current year, 50% deposit is required. To book a hunt in a future year, a 25% confirmation deposit is required and is subject to a \$1,000.00 cancellation or change fee. By January 1st, of the year of the hunt, all deposits need to be brought up to 50% for final confirmation. Deposits are then non-refundable unless the space is filled by the cancelling party at least 60 days before the hunt. Openings are very limited, so please book early to assure space!

INCLUSIONS AND EXCLUSIONS:

Our hunting and fishing packages include everything that you will need once you arrive at Wildman Lake Lodge except: guns & ammo, hunting license and tags, sleeping bag, liquor and personal items.
